	For <i>General English</i> , IELTS Standard Academic – minimum overall score 4.0.
	IELTS UKVI Academic would only be required if a student were not to meet the required English Language requirement for undergraduate
	study and were to apply for a joint CAS number to allow them to enrol onto an intensive Pre-Sessional English programme after which they
	would enrol directly onto a degree level programme. This would mean

	that after finishing the intensive English language programme the student would not need to return home to apply for a Tier 4 General Student Visa TOEFL IBT – minimum score 80 with minimum 20 across subcategories.

MODULES / COURSES	Modules must be pre-approved BEFORE an application is submitted by your academic course leader and International Office. Module approval from UCLAN will be assessed on previous academic study.
	The Study Abroad Team will send students a list of modules for students to choose from. Once students have enrolled, they must check their timetables. Once teaching starts students will no longer be able to make changes to their timetables. The Study Abroad Team will provide a final date by which students will be able to make changes for both Full Year/Sem 1 and Sem 2 – changes will only be possible if there is a clash between modules.
	Semester 1 students must check if they have exams in January as they will need to stay in the UK to take these or arrange to take them remotely if possible.
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	Unfortunately, UCLan cannot guarantee in advance that students will be eligible for courses indicated in their application. In addition, we cannot guarantee that courses will be running after the student has enrolled. Students must check their timetable upon enrolment to ensure there are no timetable clashes

ACCOMMODATION TYPES	There are around 2200 accommodation places in University owned and leased halls of residence. On campus accommodation is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.  En-suite options are available to full year students only.
ACCOMMODATION THES	Although we do not recommend this, it is possible for students to live off campus. Students wishing to live off campus in private accommodation are responsible for making their own arrangements with the Landlord.
HEALTH INSURANCE	Incoming exchange students must provide their own personal and travel insurance. International Exchange students may need private medical insurance for emergency care – this is their responsibility to check with insurers.
	All students can register with our Student Health Centre. It is free to see a doctor, but students must pay for medication. Prescription charges apply to all at the current price of £9.15 per item (as of Sept 2020).
LIVING COSTS	The approximate cost of living per month (including rent) is £1023. This is only an estimate according to the UK Home Office.
LIVING COSTS	As all accommodation is self-catering you will find very reasonably priced shops and food outlets on or close to the campus such as Aldi/Lidl and Tesco.

WELCOME WEEK	During your first few weeks we will be running a Welcome Week programme to help all students settle into life at the University of Central Lancashire and in the UK. UCLan Welcome is a festival of activities and information sessions designed to help you get used to life at UCLan as well as life in the UK; along with a calendar of social events where you can meet other new students.
	Students will be issued with the International Arrival Guide before August, as well as a link to the Freshers' Week Programme of Events.
	Welcome Week is <u>mandatory</u> for all international students.
	The Study Abroad Team also hold a free getting to know you, welcome event in early October and early February, in which exchange students meet the team and other exchange students. We also arrange one UK based trip per semester for exchange students *small contribution required from exchange students to participate. **subject to COVID-19 Regulations
DOCUMENTS REQUIRED ON ARRIVAL	All students should provide their passport for proof of ID. Passports and visas will be checked during enrolment. Students are also advised to bring copies of their offer letter/CAS Letter and original academic transcript.

<u>Tier 4 (T4) visa</u> - if you are coming to the UK to study here on a full-time programme of study for more than 6 months.

You must apply for a Tier 4 visa in your home country; you cannot apply for a Tier 4 visa when you arrive in the UK. It is very important that you prepare carefully before you apply for a Tier 4 visa.

Short-term study (STSV) visa - if you are coming to the UK to study here for 6 months or less; for example, if you are an exchange student coming to study for a semester. You can also apply for a Short-term study visa if you are coming to the UK to study an English language programme, which lasts up to 11 months.

If you only apply for semester 1 and wish to extend for a full year then you will have to return home to apply for a visa even if you are on a Tier 4 Visa.

You should apply for either type of visa before you leave your home country; doing this is called 'entry clearance'.

#### eGates

eGates present a new, quicker and easier way of crossing the border and entering the UK. There are over 250 eGates in place at 15 air and rail ports in the UK to enable quicker travel into the UK. Please take a look at the The Gov.UK webpage <u>Guide to faster travel through the UK border</u> which features a video showing how to use the eGates.

Entering the UK via an eGate (Tier 4 Students)

If you are a tier 4 student from one of the following countries: **Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Singapore, South Korea, USA**, then you can enter the UK via an eGate but this means that your visa will not be endorsed with an entry stamp by a member of the Border Force staff. If you chose to use an eGate it is very important that you keep evidence of your travel to the UK. This could be a boarding card, ticket or booking confirmation. You will be required to present your evidence of travel upon enrolment at UCLan in place of an entry stamp. This will provide evidence of your arrival in the UK.

Entering the UK via an eGate (Short Term Study Visa Students)

If you are entering the UK as a short-term student and you are from one of the following countries: Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand,

Singapore, South Korea, USA, then you must NOT use the E-Gates at the airport as you will not receive a stamp in your passport. Instead, you should follow the sign for 'see an officer' so you can speak to a border force official and obtain your short-term student visa stamp. The UKVI have produced a document which you can print out and show on arrival to the UK to ensure that you are not directed to the eGates.
